



FROM THE PRINCIPAL

...those who say, "By our tongues we will prevail; our own lips will defend us - who is lord over us?" Psalm 12:4

Abraham Kuyper points out, 'There is not a square inch in the whole domain of our human existence over which Christ, who is Sovereign over all, does not cry, Mine!'

We often hear Jesus Christ described as Lord or God addressed at the start of prayer as, 'Dear Lord...'

Kurt Bruner, from Focus on the Family, is helpful in guiding our understanding of what it means to say Jesus is Lord:

First, the word Christ means "messiah." Simply put, Jesus Christ is God in the flesh. He came in human form, lived a sinless life, and allowed himself to be sacrificed to save us from sin and death (John 1:14,29; John 3:16; Romans 6:23; 1 John 3:4-5).

Second, the word Lord means "ruler." Christianity teaches that we have been purchased at the high price of Christ's sacrifice. Our lives no longer belong to us, but to God. As the Bible explains, "You were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's" (1 Corinthians 6:20, NKJV). So we proclaim "Christ is Lord" to acknowledge that we willingly submit to Jesus as the rightful ruler of our lives.

The Scriptures describe Jesus Christ as Lord over everything: "For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him be the glory forever!" (Romans 11:36). But we need to guide our children from mere verbal affirmation and head knowledge to a true heart connection.

Jesus Christ is Lord of Emmanuel Christian School. We exist to serve Jesus. Part of the way we do that is to provide quality Christian education. We also can share with students about Jesus and his precious Word. We can pray and know God exists. This is a wonderful context for our students to grow up in.
